FROM THE VICE COMMANDANT (ACTING COMMANDANT)







With the hospitalization and passing of The Academy Commandant, Admiral Glen Diebold last month, the Academy has been busy regrouping.

Glen had many directorships and a number of unfinished projects. His assistant Directors stepped into some of his busiest and most popular Colleges. Other Colleges and projects were closed, either temporarily for work next year, or permanently, if the graduate numbers indicated that the students were not taking them anymore. A couple of his projects were picked up by willing faculty and are expected to be completed sometime in 2019.

We have brought in new members to train as Directors, and are conducting audits to evaluate the Curriculum. These audits look at the numbers of graduates for each College and School, and whether or not some Colleges are still relevant to our membership.

We have identified a number of projects for next year, including a more futuristic or analytical approach to some of our real-life topics.

My hope is that we can create fewer name-and-date type Colleges in Military Studies and explore the socioeconomic factors leading to war, and the technologies and medical applications of military innovations.

In Medicine, I hope we can create Colleges covering innovations in treatments and in limb and organ replacement, and keep these Colleges up to date.

In Science, we need Colleges that keep up with the newest discoveries in the fossil records, the latest theories of our origins, the newest discoveries in space, and the future of the human race.

These are just a few of the ideas I'm discussing with the rest of the command team, which includes our Staff and Deans.

STARFLEET's roots are Star Trek, and Star Trek ideals shall always be the heart of Academy. We need to look to the future, and not remain mired in the past. We must write for the new generations entering STARFLEET, so that Academy remains relevant to the Members This is our First Duty.

IN MEMORIAM

Admiral Glen Diebold

Born: October 24,1949. End of Watch: September 26, 2018

Glen was many things to many people: A Husband, Father, Grandfather, Marine, POW, Corrections officer, STARFLEET officer, Academy Director, Ghost Writer, Dean, Vice Commandant, and Commandant. And he was My Friend.

Besides service to our country, and STARFLEET, he was involved in church and charity in his community, most recently, Meals on Wheels.

He joined STARFLEET in 2001, and soon after, he contacted me for a position in Academy. He was especially interested in my own College of Survival Studies, but it was a year or two later, that I was ready to pass on my first College to him. He tested out, took it over in 2003, and ran with it. He expanded the 4-course College into one of 95 courses, that covers survival in many situations.

We worked together to support the needs of other STARFLEET departments, such as the Chaplains and SpecOps (Now MACO) by helping to develop an SO training manual and courses to support their activities.

Over the 15 years he was with us, he created 3,157 Courses, directed 100 Colleges, and created 4 Institutes. He had active projects on the table at the time he was called to his Next Mission, and was actively working on those until he became ill and was hospitalized on September 2.

I had the privilege of working with him on most of his projects over the years, and we discovered that we shared the same ideas, often joking about being "joined at the hip" or "in each other's minds".

Glen was an inspiration to many Members, as evidenced from the many emails of condolences coming in from the Fleet. His real-life Military and First Responder Colleges consistently had the most graduates across Academy. I teased him about having his own "Fan Club", seeing that many of the same Members were taking all his courses. :-)

Glen left his legacy in Academy, and he will be missed, but not soon forgotten.

The Academy has renamed the 4,400 Boothby Award to the Glen Diebold Boothby Award, in his honor.

SO YOU WANT TO BE A DIRECTOR

Basic requirements are: Be at least 18 years of age and have taken OTS and OCC. Cadets at least 14 years of age may serve with an adult mentor.

To assume a vacancy, you must pass all of the exams in the College, or if a College of 35 to 60 exams, 75% of the exams. Colleges over 60 exams are tested out at 50%, with a maximum of 50 exams required.

Assistant Directors must meet the same requirements as the Director.

To direct a College of your own creation, first check the College Catalogue to make certain your idea is not already being used.

If the concept is not being used elsewhere, submit a College outline, exam, and key to the Course Development Contact Jill Rayburn at: jazdansfa@gmail.com

She will determine where your College fits within the Academy structure and introduce you to your Dean, who will lead you through the approval process.

It's official: The Big Bang Theory is ending after Season 12.

The comedy's upcoming season will be its last, Warner Bros. Television, CBS and Chuck Lorre Productions announced in a joint statement. It will finish its run in 2019 as the longest-running multi-camera series in television history, with 279 episodes, outstripping another Lorre sitcom, *Two and a Half Men*.

"We are forever grateful to our fans for their support of *The Big Bang Theory* during the past twelve seasons," said the producers. "We, along with the cast, writers and crew, are extremely appreciative of the show's success and aim to deliver a final season, and series finale, that will bring *The Big Bang Theory* to an epic creative close."

The Big Bang Theory, which debuted in 2007 and has received 52 Emmy

nominations and 10 wins, including four Lead Actor wins for Jim Parsons.







Ruby Rose suits up as The CW's Batwoman

We can turn off the Bat signal, because Batwoman has arrived!

The CW has unveiled our first look at Ruby Rose in her Colleen Atwood-designed Batwoman supersuit — and it looks very comic book accurate with the Bat-symbol, the cape, and, of course, Kate Kane's patented long red hair.

Rose will make her debut as the popular Gotham City hero in this year's three-night Arrowverse crossover "Elseworlds," which will include *Arrow*, *The Flash*, and *Supergirl*. If everything goes according to plan, Rose will also headline her own Batwoman series as the network is currently developing a stand-alone series around

the character, too. The modern incarnation of Batwoman was important when she debuted in 2006 because she was one of DC Comics' first openly gay characters, and Rose will make a similar splash if the show gets picked up to series, making her the lead of the first TV series focused on an LGBT gay Superhero.

Although details about the crossover are scarce, we do know a few things. First, Supergirl (Melissa Benoist), Green Arrow (Stephen Amell), and the Flash (Grant Gustin) wind up traveling to Gotham City because of the machinations of Dr. John Deegan, a possibly insane Arkham Asylum doctor played by Lost's Jeremy Davies. Furthermore, the epic event will also introduce the Monitor (Designated Survivor's LaMonica Garrett), a DC Comics character of multiversal



importance, Lois Lane (<u>Grimm</u>'s Elizabeth Tulloch), and Nora Fries (Cassandra Jean Amell). Tyler Hoechlin will also reprise the role of Superman.

"Elseworlds" begins Sunday, Dec. 9, with *The Flash* at 8 P.M.; continues Monday, Dec. 10, at 8 P.M. with *Arrow*; and concludes the following night at 8 P.M. with *Supergirl*.

THIS IS WHAT HAPPENED TO DATA AFTER STAR TREK



As Lt. Commander Data on Star Trek: The Next Generation, Brent Spiner saved the ship on more than one occasion, provided comic relief, and allowed the show to explore ethical questions of personhood, sentience, and even slavery through his android character's very existence. In addition to his role as Data, Spiner also portrayed other characters on the show, such as Data's "brother" Lore and his "father," Dr. Soong. But what happened to Data after the series was over—and what has actor Brent Spiner been up to since?

In 1996, Spiner made an appearance in Roland Emmerich's smash science fiction hit Independence Day—although many fans may not have recognized him, because his character was so drastically different from Data. You can spot Spiner in the part of Dr. Brackish Okun, the unkempt and enthusiastic director of Area 51 who joins a surgical team during an autopsy on one of the aliens. Although Okun appears to meet a messy end, it was revealed that he survived; Spiner returned to reprise his role as Okun in the 2016 sequel, Independence Day: Resurgence.

Although The Next Generation ended its television run in 1994, that wasn't the end of Data's story. Spiner returned to the role in four Star Trek movies featuring the TNG cast, starting with Star Trek Generations (1994) and followed by Star Trek: First Contact (1996), Star Trek: Insurrection (1998), and Star Trek: Nemesis (2002).

Throughout the big-screen Trek franchise's TNG era, Spiner had a variety of opportunities to explore his character's arc further. In Generations, Data finally decides to install the emotion chip Dr. Soong created for him, with mixed results. In First Contact, he plays an integral role when he's captured by the queen of the Borg Collective, who attempts to turn him against the Federation. During Insurrection, Data becomes a central part of the plot when he "malfunctions" during an away mission—which leads Picard and the crew of the Enterprise to discover a shadowy plot.

In Nemesis, Spiner played dual roles, appearing as B-4, an earlier Soong-type android, as well as Data, who works with the rest of the crew to stop a Reman leader determined to destroy the Romulan Empire and wipe out all life on Earth.

Even though Data's storyline was wrapped up during the course of 2002's Star Trek: Nemesis, the franchise wasn't completely done with Spiner. While the door was left open for the character of Data to potentially return, Spiner felt he'd gotten too old to play the ageless android—but in 2004, he appeared on the prequel television series Star Trek: Enterprise in a three-episode arc as Arik Soong, a geneticist and ancestor of Data's creator, Dr. Noonien Soong. (http://memory-alpha.wikia.com/wiki/Arik_Soong)

In the episodes, Soong—a doctor of genetics with questionable ethics—steals and alters some genetically engineered embryos. In doing so, he creates the "Augments," who he regards as his children. Although he's imprisoned for his actions, Soong is later recruited by the Federation to help track down and stop his "children," who are running violently amok in the galaxy and attempting to start a human-Klingon war.

In 2011, Spiner co-created and starred in his own web series, Fresh Hell. The show, available on YouTube, depicts a fictionalized version of Spiner, who's trying to rebuild his career after an unspecified high-profile "incident" causes him to lose everything.

THIS IS WHAT HAPPENED TO DATA AFTER STAR TREK (2)

The comedic take on Spiner's career shines in the writing, such as when a talk show host tells a guest, "We had a guest on yesterday whose face was literally ripped off by a pit bull. You know what she said to me? 'At least I'm not Brent Spiner.'" Spiner takes a neighbor under his wing, an erstwhile porn star who wants to become a real actress, and the two attempt to break back into Hollywood together. The episodes are short and funny, and fans who haven't seen it yet should definitely give Fresh Hell a watch. (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=JveAkAo6FLA)

In 2002, Spiner appeared as bad guy Devlin Bowman in the Dana Carvey comedy The Master of Disguise. Bowman has just finished



serving a two decade prison sentence, and he's determined to get his revenge on the man who put him in prison—who just happens to be the father of Carvey's character, Pistachio Disguisey. After Bowman kidnaps the elder Disguisey, it's up to Pistachio to follow in his father's footsteps and learn to be a "master of disguise" in order to save him.

Basically, the entire movie was a vehicle to showcase Dana Carvey's impressive mimicry skills, and it didn't work: The Master of Disguise was a critical flop that, according to the BBC's film critic, made other juvenile humor films like Deuce Bigalow: Male Gigolo "look like the comic equivalents of Citizen Kane."

In 2005, Spiner starred along with Peter Dinklage and Carla Gugino in the CBS sci-fi series Threshold. The trio formed the core of a secret U.S. governmental think tank tasked with humanity's first extraterrestrial contact, with Spiner playing Dr. Nigel Fenway, a NASA microbiologist brought onto the top-secret "Red Team" in charge of researching and containing an incident on an American naval vessel where several crew members died horribly after encountering an unidentified flying object. What Fenway and the rest of the team discover about the aliens and their ability to manipulate DNA could possibly put the entire world at risk. Although it was canceled after only one season, Threshold is a must-watch for Brent Spiner fans.

Because Spiner has such a rich theater background, it probably shouldn't be surprising that he's done plenty of voiceover work over the years. He's skilled at doing impressions of other actors, and has been known to spoof his TNG co-star Patrick Stewart at sci-fi conventions. In the 1999 movie South Park: Bigger, Longer & Uncut, he provided the voice of talk-show host Conan O'Brien, and he's also taken voice roles on several TV shows, including Generator Rex, Young Justice, The Avengers: Earth's Mightiest Heroes, The Simpsons, Star Wars Rebels, Hulk and the Agents of S.M.A.S.H., and Justice League Action. If you're a fan of the video game Elite Dangerous, now you can get Spiner's voice in your spaceship; he provided a voice pack for Vega in 2016.

Since 2016, Spiner's biggest project has been the Cinemax horror series Outcast, in which he plays Sidney, a mysterious preacher involved in a tale of demonic possession and other supernatural happenings in a small West Virginia town. In an interview with the A.V. Club, Spiner compared Sidney to Data. "[Sidney] is the most difficult character to describe on the show," he argued. "But kind of like Data on Star Trek, I'm finding this character similar in the sense that we're sort of discovering him and building him as we go along. It's kind of like I'm figuring out the character at the same time the audience is."

For fans who loved Spiner's work as Data, seeing him in such a dark role might be disturbing at first, but it showcases a menacing side of his acting—one we haven't really seen since Data's brother Lore was deactivated for good.

STAR TREK: DISCOVERY'S SPOCK IS ACTOR ETHAN PECK



One of the biggest casting questions of *Star Trek: Discovery's* second season was addressed as CBS has revealed who will don the famous pointed ears of *Enterprise* science officer Spock in 2019: the answer is actor **Ethan Peck**.

The 32-year-old Los Angeles native, grandson of legendary Hollywood actor Gregory Peck, will take on the role of Michael Burnham's foster brother — and future *Star Trek* legend — Mr. Spock in the upcoming second year of *Discovery*, following in the footsteps of Zachary Quinto (who was the second primary actor to inhabit the role in the Kelvin Timeline films), and of course, the man who began the character, the late Leonard Nimoy.

Now based in the US, Dougray recalls the original 1980s Triffids TV series, starring John Duttine fighting Triffids operated by a man inside a fibreglass shell on a stool with a fan. But he has fonder memories of reading the novel as a boy.

For those who don't know, the story begins with a meteor storm which blinds those who see it. As society descends into chaos, a plant bred for oil manages to overthrow its confines and starts wreaking havoc with deadly intent. Dougray's character retains

his sight, having been under bandages following an operation. As anarchy unfolds, he hooks up with a radio journalist (Nip/Tuck star Joely Richardson).

Stephen says: "The writer of our version has heavily updated the Wyndham concept, which was written at a time when people feared nuclear proliferation. There was that great fear of nuclear escape and his novel had a sort of cathartic response to that. Our production is doing a similar thing, only we've updated it to the genetic modification of plants created to replace oil in a world where oil has disappeared, which could be in the very near future".

TNG SILVER COINS



The New Zealand Mint has just released the third and fourth silver coin notes in their limited-edition *Star Trek: The Next Generation* Silver Coin Note Collection, and the notes capture the essence of the *TNG* episodes "The Best of Both Worlds, Part I" and "Redemption, Part I" via art by Juan Ortiz.

"The Best of Both Worlds, Part I" was the cliffhanger final episode of *TNG*'s third season. "Redemption, Part I" was season four's 26th episode, which saw the *Enterprise* travel to the Klingon Empire and attempt to thwart an impeding civil war. The notes are mini replicas of the poster artwork designed by Juan Ortiz for each episode; the use of color and engraving reflect the spirit of each.

The notes are made from 5g pure silver, which is used to good effect in the design. The unique number in the mintage is printed on each and they are packaged inside a protective sleeve. Details of the coin note's authenticity are printed on the reverse of the sleeve.

The obverse of each silver note has the Ian Rank-Broadley effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and is legal tender in Niue. Both releases are part of a seven-note *Star Trek: The Next Generation* Silver Coin Note Collection. A hardcover *Star Trek: The Next Generation* Collector's Album, which is included with the purchase of the "Encounter at Farpoint, Part I" Coin Note, features a page for each note.
